Learning outcomes

- » Students know stories sometimes give plants and animals attributes they do not really have. (Kindergarten Life Sciences)
- » Students know different plants and animals inhabit different kinds of environments and have external features that help them thrive in different kinds of places. (Grade 1 Life Sciences)
- » Students know living things cause changes in the environment in which they live: some of these changes are detrimental to the organism or other organisms, and some are beneficial. (Grade 3 Life Sciences)


Books we read

Today's craft: Enriching Earthworms



You will need:

- » Earthworms sheet
 (included)
- » Cardstock
- » Crayons or colored pencils
- » Brown construction paper
- » Scotch tape

Directions:

- 1. Print out the earthworms sheet.
- 2. Color in the sheet and add plants that the earthworms are helping to grow.
- 3. Tape a piece of brown construction paper over the bottom half of the sheet, making it into a flap to lift up and peek at your earthworms.
