Many people talk about earth as the "blue planet" because oceans cover 70% of Earth's surface. These oceans hold nearly our entire water supply, too: 97%.

The deepest part of the ocean is deeper (about 36,000 ft. or 11,000 m.) than the tallest mountain (about 29,000 ft. or 8800 m.)

About 6.4 million tons of trash reach the oceans each year. Most of this is plastic, which sea birds and turtles eat, thinking it is food. Many of these animals die since they cannot digest the plastic.

The Philippines is home to some of the most diverse coral reefs in the world, but many of the fish and coral that live there are being harmed by people who put cyanide in the water to stun the fish and collect them to be sold in the U.S. for home aquariums.

Growing up Asian in America is an annual essay and art contest. The contest always has a theme and prizes are awarded each year. This year there is an added program with prizes for a science contest about oceans.

IDEAS FOR YOUR CONTEST ENTRY

Use the following questions to help guide your writing or the creation of your artwork. You don't have to answer any of these questions as long as your entry is about oceans and being Asian and/or American.

- » What are some of the dangers our oceans face? What can you and others do to help protect our oceans?
- » There are five oceans in the world. Is there an ocean that is special to you or your family or to the Asian country of your family or ancestors?
- » Many people love the ocean. What have you done that is fun, interesting or exciting that includes an ocean?
- » If you could be any living thing in the ocean—a fish, a mammal, a plant—what would you want to be and why? What would your life be like?
- » If an alien came to visit earth and asked you about the oceans, how would you describe them and what would you want the alien to know about our oceans?
- » What plants and animals might you find on the beach or coast of California, China, Taiwan, Japan, India, the Philippines, Korea, Vietnam or another Asian country?

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

- All students entering Grades 6 through 8 in the 2012-13 school year are welcome to enter.
- Cannot be a child of a contest judge or screener. (See official contest rules for further details.) Winning entries are selected based on creativity and originality, ideas and feelings, and skill in the category (writing or art).

ENTRY GUIDELINES

Art

Maximum Size: 8.5" x 11"

Materials and Media: Anything two-dimensional. All paints, crayons, colored pencils, markers, photos, computer generated graphics, etc., are accepted.

No sculptures or pop-ups, please.

Essay or Poem

Format: $8-1/2'' \times 11''$ paper, minimum font size 12. Handwritten essays or poems accepted.

General

You may send one entry in each category (e.g. one piece of writing and one piece of art). If you send two pieces of writing or two pieces of art, only one will be considered. Art is judged separately from essays and poems, so please do not submit an entry that combines writing with art.

Each entry must have a complete entry form. If you send one artwork and one essay, please complete one form for each.

Prizes

One prize will be awarded in each category (writing and art) at the following levels:

First Place: \$1500 Second Place: \$750 Third Place: \$500

Honorable Mention: \$250

Winning entries will be honored in an exhibition in public libraries co-created by the winners and Academy staff.
